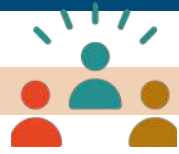
Regional Team for the Americas and the Caribbean

Humanitarian Project

Due In the framework of the Humanitarian Project for Migration in Colombia, the team of the Health Care Unit (HCU) of Arauca carried out three brigades (one in the indigenous community of Eñapa, another to the urban center to attend to migrant sex workers and another to attend to the transgender population in a condition of migration). The previous brigades had key messages on health and protection, as well as the delivery of food and dignity kits.



CASH actions in communities

Teams from the Salvadoran Red Cross continue their work in 15 communities in the Department of Ahuachapan, where they are holding meetings with the technical focus group for the implementation of CASH actions in communities that have benefited from the LARRA Project. More than 100 families affected by multi-hazards in the area will benefit from the implementation of the Cash program with the support of the American Red Cross.



Mexico Recovery Program

The LAC Delegation of the American Red Cross and the Mexican Red Cross finished the FY20 Virtual Lessons Learned Workshop of the Community Earthquake Resilience Program with more than 60 people connected each day, representatives from the National Headquarters, field teams, volunteers and representatives of community brigades from the delegations in Chiapas, Morelos, Oaxaca, Puebla of the Mexican Red Cross. It was an exchange of experiences and learnings that will be applied for next year of project implementation.
